Low emission zones set an environmental limit on certain road space, restricting access for the most polluting vehicles to improve air quality and so protect public health within our towns and cities, making them more attractive places in which to live, work and visit.

If you drive in Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh or Glasgow you'll need to know about their planned low emission zones, find out how to keep up-to-speed with the changes and how they might affect you.

Low emission zones – what's happening?

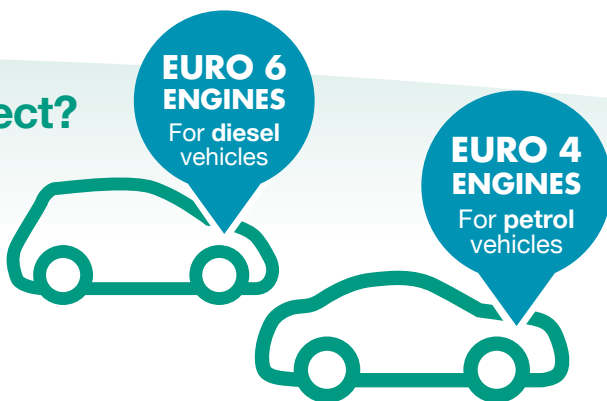
The Scottish Government has committed to introduce low emission zones into Scotland's four biggest cities: Glasgow, Edinburgh, Aberdeen and Dundee. Each low emission zone in Scotland is being designed based on local requirements following consultation.

Glasgow became the first city in Scotland to begin operating a low emission zone at the end of 2018. Until 31 December 2022, it will only focus on local bus services but, after that date, the low emission scope coverage will extend to all vehicles.

The roll-out of low emission zones in Scotland is progressing all the time – please register at www.lowemissionzones.scot to be kept up-to-date with how they might affect you.

Who will they affect?

The Transport (Scotland) Act 2019 proposes that access to each low emission zone will be based on Euro emission engine classification standards – as a minimum, Euro 6/VI for diesel and Euro 4/IV for non-diesel vehicles.



When will we know for sure?

The Transport Scotland Act 2019 provides the legislation to enable the creation and civil enforcement of low emission zones. The national standards for low emission zones – such as emission levels, penalties and exemptions – will be set in regulations currently in development and due to be published later in 2020. Local authorities will then use these regulations to design each low emission zone based on their specific, local requirements.
