



If you drive in Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh or Glasgow you'll need to know about the Low Emission Zones that were introduced in May 2022.

Here's a snapshot of what it's all about...

- LEZs aim to improve air quality by stopping the most polluting vehicles from entering the zone.
- Any vehicles entering a zone must meet minimum emission standards or will face a fine.
- Certain exemptions are in place.



Low Emission Zones help to improve air quality, protect public health and encourage people to use more public transport and cleaner vehicles.

Minimum emission standards for entering a LEZ are:

- Euro 4 for petrol cars and vans (generally vehicles registered from 2006*)
- Euro 6 for diesel cars and vans (generally vehicles registered from September 2015*)
- *These dates are only indicative please check with your vehicle manual or the manufacturer to confirm.

LEZs will be enforced from 1 June 2023 in Glasgow (with an additional year for residents within the zone), 30 May 2024 in Dundee and 1 June 2024 in Aberdeen and Edinburgh.

Certain exemptions will apply, including Blue Badge holders and emergency vehicles.
